Times Tables Rock Stars and Numbots Easter Challenge

After the success of our last TTRS battle, we are excited to announce our new challenge! The children will be competing in their House Teams to achieve the most correct answers on TTRS and Numbots over the Easter Holidays. There is a time limit of 60 minutes per day and any questions answered correctly after this daily time period will count towards their own score, not their House Team score. The winning house will earn an extra House Treat!

Children in Key Stage 2 will be able to access their challenge on Times Table Rock Stars as they usually would. We have invited children in Key Stage 1 to also take part in this battle and they are able to earn points for their House Teams using Numbots or Times Table Rock Stars. If they choose to play the games on Numbots there is no challenge to select, they just need to answer the questions as usual. If they want to play the game on TTRS, they can log in as usual and choose any game to play.

The login and password for your children/children has been sent home today, in case you need it again.

As an extra challenge, we have promised the children a special whole school reward if they manage to answer 1 million questions correctly over the period of the challenge.

Parent Survey Outcomes


Thank you to everyone who completed our Spring survey and for taking the time to write additional comments. We value your support, feedback and suggestions.

There is wide agreement among health professionals and educational professionals that school attendance is vital to the life chances of children and young people. Being in school improves health, wellbeing and socialisation throughout the life course. The greatest benefits come from children and young people attending school regularly. It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above.

<u>Attendance</u>

Please can you let school know if your child is going to be absent from school.

If we do not know the reason why your child is absent, we will follow our procedures - this is a telephone call to all contacts and a home visit. If we are unable to make contact with



you, we will refer the absence to the local authority. If you know your child is going to be absent, please complete an absence request form (available from the school office). Please note holidays in term time are not permitted. Following Local Authority guidance, penalty notices may be issued for holidays taken in term time. If your child is absent from school, please let the school office know as soon as possible by leaving a voicemail through the school telephone system or emailing <u>admin@newton-hill.org.uk</u>. Thank you for your cooperation.

Free School Meals

If your circumstances have changed you may be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) until Year 6, please contact school as the application process is changing. There is no difference for how children order or receive meals if they are eligible for FSM. If your child receives FSM (Reception to Year 6) the school will also receive additional funding to support your child. Children in receipt of FSM also received confidential support with educational visits.

School meals for children in Reception and KS1 are FREE – this is part of the universal free school meal offer.
